One-on-one oral assessment

- Students will describe a narrative text as a story with a beginning, middle, and end. (ELA-L8)
- Students will identify (point to) visual prompts of books, poems, and songs. The prompts include a display of more than one example of each type of narrative text. The items in the display are novel to the student. (They are different from the narrative texts that the students have viewed during daily lessons.) The teacher asks the student to identify the texts of each type: book, poem, song. (ELA-L8)
